Late Colonel Guilfoyle

Colonel Sean Guilfeyle, whose death occurred on Tuesday, joined the Volunteers at their foundation in 1913. When the 1916 Rising began he hed the rank of lieutenaut. During the Rising, he was officer-commanding "A" Company, 3rd Batt. In 1922 he entered the K-gelar Army, and was officer in charge of staff duties during 1922 '23. In 1924 be entered the Quartermaster General's branch with the rank of colonel. Subsequently he held the appointment of side-de-camp to the Governor General pattl 1928, when he went on the reserve. From that date until his death he was an efficial in the ESB. He was well and popularly knewn in Limerick, where he was stationed in the latter employment for some years, prior to his transfer to Dublin Me was aged about 50.
