

# Late Colonel Guilfoyle

Colonel Sean Guilfoyle, whose death occurred on Tuesday, joined the Volunteers at their foundation in 1913. When the 1916 Rising began he held the rank of lieutenant. During the Rising, he was officer-commanding "A" Company, 3rd Batt. In 1922 he entered the Regular Army, and was officer in charge of staff duties during 1922-'23. In 1924 he entered the Quartermaster General's branch with the rank of colonel. Subsequently he held the appointment of aide-de-camp to the Governor-General until 1928, when he went on the reserve. From that date until his death he was an official in the E.S.B. He was well and popularly known in Limerick, where he was stationed in the latter employment for some years, prior to his transfer to Dublin. He was aged about 50.
