

# Prominent Tipperary Man

## Passes Away in A Lorry

When driving in a beet lorry from Nenagh to Cashel on Monday to attend a seed beetgrowers' meeting there Mr John Seymour (60), Monsea, Nenagh, had a seizure near the village of Bostisoleigh and expired in a few minutes.

In the early stages of the seizure Mr Seymour attempted to get out of the lorry and the driver, in a fruitless attempt to keep him aboard, had to relinquish his hold on the steering wheel of the lorry which crashed against a ditch, the cab becoming disconnected from the chassis.

The late Mr Seymour was chairman of the Council of the Beetgrowers' Association and chairman of the Thurles Board of Beetgrowers. A member of the North Tipperary Committee of Agriculture and a keen promoter of local and inter-county ploughing matches, he farmed extensively and was one of the most prominent figures in the agricultural life of North Tipperary.
