TEA RATION AND TRADERS' SUPPLIES.

Aid. James Reidy, T.D. (F.G., Limerick), has received the following letter, dated 12th inst., from the Department of Supplies, Ballsbridge, Dublin: "I am directed by the Minister for Supplies to refer to your recent representations regarding the special allocations of tea to enable the ration of one ounce per person per week to be met, in the case of traders who receive their total supplies from United Kingdom wholesalers. In reply, I am to state that special allocations were duly made to United Kingdom wholesalers for distribution to their Irish trader customers, and the non-receipt by those customers of their additional supplies may be due to delay in distributing the special allocations on the part of the wholesalers concerned. The traders should, therefore, communicate direct with their wholesale suppliers in the matter. I am further to state that if you will be so good as to request the traders who have not yet received their additional supplies to communicate to him particulars of their quotas with their United Kingdom suppliers, the Minister will have inquiry into their cases made immediately."

The deceased was a former member of the old Charleville Rural District Council.
