Circuit Court, in which the cause of action was exactly the same, a decree for £150 had been given against a Trades Union and was confirmed on appeal to the High Court.

Justice-I must hold with Mr. Gaffney, as Mr. Mescall would never have ceased to employ Moloney if he had not been approached by defendants. Accordingly, I will give a decree for £27 12s., with 10/- expenses.

# DEATH OF MISS H. O'BRIEN, LISNAGRY

It is with deepest regret that we chronicle the passing away over the week-end of Miss Helen O'Brien, Lisnagry. Her death at an early age has removed from camogie. circles in Limerick one of the best county players. On the camogie field she had distinguished herself with the Ahane Club and her brilliance in wielding the caman earned for her a place on the Limerick team which opposed Tipperary and Cork ladies last year. Limerick camogie is poorer by the loss of such an ardent supporter of the code. To her bereaved family profound sympathy is tendered on their sorrow.

#### GLASS HOUSES!

British experts are considering schemes for making house walls of hollow glass bricks, which, it is said, will be as strong as concrete.
