

OBITUARY

MRS. DOROTHY LEAHY.

It is with feelings of deep regret that we chronicle the death at Barrington's Hospital, of Mrs. D. Leahy (nee O'Gorman), wife of Mr. Jack Leahy, N.T., Principal of Knocka National School, and of this city, and daughter of Mr. Patrick and the late Mrs. O'Gorman, Thurles.

The contraction of a severe illness, brief as it was, brought about her sad end. It decreed medical assistance unavailing, and, despite all the unremitting care and attention, she passed away on last Sunday morning, the 31st ult., resigned with fortitude and calm to meet her Maker.

Her demise, at a comparatively early age, has evoked widespread manifestations of sorrow in Thurlane, Athy and Limerick, where she was deservedly esteemed. Of kind and affable disposition, she possessed all the traits of an endearing personality.

The removal of the remains took place on Sunday evening to Our Lady Queen of Peace Church, Jamesboro', where Requiem Mass at 8.30 was celebrated next day for the happy repose of her soul. The funeral in the afternoon to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery was largely and representatively attended, testifying to the popularity of deceased and bereaved.
