TO VISIT IRELAND

The Archbishop of New York, Most Rev. Dr. Spellman, who is now in London, will visit Ireland next week. His Grace is to visit his Eminence Cardinal MacRory at Armagh on April 1 or 2. An invitation to Dublin issued by Mr. D. Gray, United States Minister, has been accepted by his Grace, but the actual date of his visit is not yet known.

SECURITY OF TENURE

The National Agricultural Party will contest the forthcoming general election mainly on the issue of security of tenure of the farmers. At a convention, Mr. P. Belton, T.D., read legal opinion to the effect that no fixity of tenure existed and that the Land Commission was entitled to compulsorily acquire land for special purposes, and that objection by the occupier, or appeal against the price offered, might fail.
