what he has seen and experienced there. He gives a very intimate and illuminating picture of life in that dark Continent, of the ways and customs of the natives, and of all that the missionaries have to put up with in their work out there for the spread of the Faith. It is a highly informative publication and is excellent value for the modest 6d. at which it is sold. Impressive and spiritually stimulating in its descriptions of how the conquest of souls is proceeding in Barotseland, it has also many gleams of humour to enliven its pages. Describing the climate in summer, for instance, Father Fintan says that at 100 degrees you could pretty well fry eggs in the sun, but when it reaches 120 "the devil goes back home to cool off." No one can peruse this cursorily valuable booklet even without a feeling of warm appreciation and reverence for the Fathers who Missionary themselves to the noble work of dispelling paganism under adverse circumstances and conditions so graphically described within the compass of its 52 very readable pages.
