**THE MUNSTER FAIR**

The Munster fair at Limerick this  
 morning was of average size. Trade  
 was brisk, very brisk, and all cattle  
 on offer exchanged hands at in-  
 creased values. Prices advanced by  
 at least £1 per head all round, as  
 compared with the last Munster  
 fair. Average prices—3 year-old  
 heifers, £28 10s. to £31 10s.; 2 year-  
 olds, £18 10s. to £21 15s.; 1 year-olds,  
 £13 5s. to £17 15s.; 3 year-old  
 bullocks, £29 10s. to £33; 2 year-olds,  
 £16 10s. to £21; 1 year-olds, £8 10s.  
 to £14; fat cows were snapped up at  
 prices ranging from £29 to £32, and  
 fat bulls sold as high as £31 per  
 head. Prime beef, scarce, 70/- per  
 cwt. on foot.
