WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, May 19th—Cattle—Larger numerical dimensions in both sections of to-day's market, with more strong cattle. Beef a full supply, although quality not up to last week, firm demand and ready exchange. Nicely finished heifers freely bid for and cashed, and well fed young cows easily placed. Good trade for prime cattle, quality and condition commanded ready buyers. In stores a large selection of nice feeders; two year old bullocks hardly met as active a trade as last week, and in some cases vendors stood out for stiffer rates. However, there was fairly good trade for polly bullocks, and these met good demand and were readily cashed; backward and rough cattle slow. Inquiry for nice two year old dairy heifers. In the yearling section business was brisker, with active enquiry and sharp competition for top lots; full previous terms freely paid. Choice shapely yearlings on short legs drew best rates. Good attendance, shipping and local interest well represented. Proceedings wound up with a strong and satisfactory finish, substantial turnover and good clearance. Fat heifers and bullocks, small, £25 to £30 15s.; fat cows, best, £29 to £37 10s.; second run, £21 10s. to £27 10s.; old, £12 10s. to £19 10s.; two year old heifers and bullocks, best, £20 5s. to £26; second run, £14 to £18 17s. 6d.; yearling bullocks and heifers, best, £12 10s. to £15 5s.; second run, £8 2s. to £11 15s.

Sheep—Substantial increase on last week; a fairly useful turnout, with a good number of choice pens. Prime wethers and hoggets met satisfactory demand, with firm trade. The demand for best sheep tightened up prices, previous full rates repeated, anything with condition and quality had buyers. Young ewes with condition sold well, old ewes dull. Store hoggets not as good a class as last week, and consequently trade was hardly as active. All round enquiry well sustained. Buyers operated freely, which meant a quick sale. Trade well supported and satisfactory clearance. Fat middle weight, 135/- to 144/-; second run, 96/- to 120/-; hoggets, best, 113/- to 127/-; second run, 100/- to 107/-; stores, 66/- to 92/6.—Wm. B. Tuesday, May 18th—A full seasonable supply, entries numbering the same as last week, with a fair proportion of heifers and cows; entry a good class, including quite a number of high grade cows and heifers; plenty of buyers for all useful and promising lots; this class, with colour and quality, were bid for and bought freely. Choice heifers and dairy cows, with size and milking capacity, met good competition and were readily sold. Steady demand for dairy cows of the right stamp, secondary and old cows difficult to place. All round there was good selling trade for the right class and a good clearance effected. Top price for incalf heifers went to Mr. John Moloney, Ballynanty, Limerick, at £38, and for dairy cows to Mr. T. E. Lloyd, auctioneer, Boru House, Limerick, at £41, the purchaser being Mr. Denis Ryan, Rathurde Castle.
