GLIN COURT

The number of cases listed for hearing at Glin Court on Wednesday, before Mr. C. S. Kenny, D.J., was unusually small and proceedings concluded in fifty minutes.

Three cases brought under the Food and Drugs Act were adjourned to the next court for the attendance of the Co. Council solicitor Mr. Roger O'Sullivan.

Sergeant Thomas McKeon summoned Joseph Fennell, Caharaglin, for having an unlicensed dog.

Complainant said that defendant had not licensed the dog since the issue of the summons and was present in court. He gave a reasonable excuse for his failure to licence the dog.

The Justice imposed a fine of 40/-.

A number of other defendants similarly summoned, were fined 10/- each, the complainants stating that the owners of the dogs had taken out the licences since the summonses were issued.

Nominal fines were imposed on a number of defendants for allowing their stock to wander.

This concluded the proceedings.
