**FAT STOCK MARKET.**

A sale was held on Tuesday last and was easily the best sale so far. Entries in sheep and cattle were above those published, and comprised a very useful description. Practically all the cattle, every one of which was under the hammer. Sheep were in fair demand, but vendors in some cases held out prices which did not allow for the slight upward trend, with the result that a good number of pens were unsold. 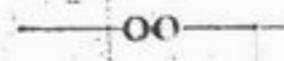
time. Cut back arabus, aubrietia and other rock plants as soon as they are finished flowering.

**FRUIT GARDEN.**

Thin out superfluous raspberry growths. Keep runners picked off the strawberry plants for another while, otherwise the plantation will get into a tangle. This is the month for thinning apples, but I am afraid that there will be few to thin on some varieties after the knocking about they got from the recent cold winds. Some varieties, however, such as Golden Spire, are carrying heavy crops, and it would pay to thin them down to one or two per spur.

A gardening class will be again held at the City Technical Institute on this (Friday) evening at 7.30, where most of these operations will be demonstrated and discussed by the Rural Science Organiser, J. J. O'Carroll.
