**WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.**

Wednesday, June 16th—Cattle—The offering of cattle showed a substantial increase on last Wednesday, and constituted a record for the season; a mixed class, with more fat and strong cattle, and many useful drafts of nice quality young stores. Strong and representative attendance of buyers, home and shipping interest being fully represented. Beef met a brisk selling trade; fat heifers and bullocks handy weights and nicely fed in strong demand, and touched top current rates; fresh young cow beef steadily placed at full values; useful feeders with quality easily negotiated, firm rates. Two year old heifers with quality commanded ready buyers, and met active enquiry and sharp competition; bullocks also a brisk trade; all round advanced rates. Yearlings a choice entry, met strong enquiry and sale, quality and condition found most favour. In young store cattle trade was buoyant and sharp. Business all round was steady, with a healthy tone and dearer rates, and wound up with a strong and satisfactory finish; market practically sold up, the sale being the largest held at the Paddocks for some time.
