erick Associate Distressing Tragedy

LIMERICK LITTLE GIRL DROWNED

A distressing tragedy occurred last evening while a party of children were playing on Donnellan's Bank, on the Shannon, when one of the number, a seven-yearsold girl named Lena Lysaght, from Killeely, slipped, it is surmised, and fell into the water. Her absence from the party, who were apparently proceeding along the bank at the time, was not immediately noticed, but on missing her the other children at once returned to make a search. To their horror they found that their little playmate had fallen into the river at a spot where the bank has a horseshoe contour. Unable to extricate the unfortunate child, who was head down in the water, her little pals had to run to Killeely, where they broke the news of the tragedy. The body was subsequently recovered and taken in the Fire Brigade Ambulance to the morgue at Barrington's Hospital. The little girl, who was the daughter of a dock labourer, only made her First Holy Communion last Saturday.
