The grafted plants often fail after a year or two and the suckers from the wild rootstock grow away instead. I have heard a nurseryman say that if you want to grow 12 c.c. matis you will have to plant 24. A good way to propagate them is to layer a long young shoot after nicking it at several joints and covering these wounded areas with sandy soil to a depth of 2 inches.
