OBITUARY

MR. D. O'CONNOR.

With very deep regret we chronicle the death of Mr. Daniel O'Connor, a member of an old Limerick family, which took place at his residence, Merlyn Park, Dublin on Friday, 2nd inst. The late Mr. O'Connor, who was in his seventy-seventh year, was connected with the commercial and sporting life of Limerick for over half a century until his retirement some years ago. He was Managing-Director of Messrs. Dan O'Connor, Ltd., Upper William Street, and in his business dealings he earned for himself the esteem, confidence and respect of the public. The fine traditions established by him in the concern which bears his name are being faithfully preserved by his nephew, Mr. G. E. Russell, B.C., who has succeeded him as chief executive.

In the realm of sport Mr. O'Connor, too, took a prominent part. He was one of the founders of the Shannon Rowing Club, and in his hey day he was, needless to say, an expert oarsman. His demise will be learned of with genuine regret and sorrow, and widespread sympathy will be extended to the widow and relatives in their bereavement.

The interment took place in Mount St. Laurence Cemetery, Limerick, following Requiem High Mass in St. Michael's Church. The cortege was fully representative of all sections of the community.
