If reasonable precautions are taken to ensure that filters are efficient and regularly cleared, and that the fuel used is suitable, then the engine wear will not be unduly excessive. If, however, plants are neglected, due to carelessness or ignorance, irreparable damage can be caused in a very short time. Wood charcoal is very free from sulphur compounds, but it is not a very excessive amount of tar and, if the filters are not cleared, the engine will soon be damaged through sticking of piston rings, valves, and thickening of the lubricating oil. Antiknock is the other hand, it is essential to free from tarry matters, but unsuitable grades may contain very high sulphur content. This is most damaging to the engine, as the sulphur compounds in the gas have a very corrosive effect on all engine parts. After causing undue piston ring wear, the compounds escape into the crankcase, combining with the lubricating oil and corroding all working bearings.
