### DEATH OF MR. T. J. LYONS, CREGANE

With very deep regret we announce the death of Mr. Thomas J. Lyons, Cregane, Charleville, which took place in the County Hospital, Croom, on Saturday night. The late Mr. Lyons, an extensive and progressive farmer, was one of the most lovable of men. Though of a quiet and retiring disposition, he won the affection, regard and esteem of all by his straightforwardness, singleness of purpose, deep-rooted sincerity, innate kindness and simplicity. Of him it can be said with all truth that he was one of nature's gentlemen. Charitable to a degree, he was ever ready and willing to give a helping hand to those in need of assistance and by his demise not only are the immediate relatives bereft of a staunch and loyal friend but a wide and ever-increasing circle of acquaintances. A widely-read and cultured man, the deceased took an enlightened interest in questions appertaining to the country's welfare, and his grasp of economic, political and other issues gave an insight into his character. He was a citizen of the first water, the possessor of a noble and generous nature; in short, he was a man whose memory will for long remain with those whose good fortune it was to be counted among his friends. Heartfelt sympathy will be tendered to his daughter and sisters, Mrs. C. C. Cregan, Limerick, and Miss Annie Lyons, and numerous other relatives.

The funeral took place to-day from Rockhill Church to the family burial ground at Anhid. The cortege was of huge proportions, being representative of an extremely wide area.
