'Bus Company are not in a position yet to run a regular service here, but arrangements should be made for at least a part-time service 068and if possible to include Sundays until mid-day. The times of departure could be made known to the people through the medium of the Press. The inauguration of such a service would be a great boon to the residents of the new housing scheme here in Prospect. Janesboro' has been catered for in this respect. Why not cater for uir.
