

a matter of much concern to a large number of the residents on the new housing scheme at Prospect.

Some three or four weeks ago I moved out here in accordance with the arrangements made by the Limerick Corporation for the clearance of the Carey's Road area. When we were coming out here we understood that a 'bus service was to ply between this new housing scheme and the city, but up to the present time the contemplation of such a service has not materialised.

This housing scheme is very far removed from any central part of the city, and many of the housekeepers have to visit the city several times during the day, and then rush back to do their housework. Moreover, there are older women residing here, my own wife included, who find it almost an impossibility on account of their age to walk the distance to the city at all. As a matter of fact, it is with great laborious effort that they are able to reach the churches to hear Mass on Sundays.

Perhaps the management of the G.S.R. 'Bus Company are not in a position yet to run a regular service here, but arrangements should be made for at least a part-time service and if possible to include Sundays until mid-day. The times of departure could be made known to the people through the medium of the Press.

The inauguration of such a service would be a great boon to the residents of the new housing scheme here in Prospect.

Janesboro' has been catered for in this respect. Why not cater for Prospect?
