nature, and will have consideration to type of casualties which might be expected at an air raid incident, and will have regard to the facilities and time which would be at the disposal of the first aider in such circumstances.

The individual team test will be based on an assumed incident as a result of which three casualties will be dealt with by each team. These casualties will be labeled, to indicate the nature of their presumed disability, and marks will be allotted for:—

- (a) correct first aid methods,
- (b) correct discrimination for priority of treatment and removal,
- (c) proper leadership of the squad leader,
- (d) correct team work,
- (e) proper methods of recording.

A time limit of about twelve minutes will be allowed for each team.

Note—During competition equipment allowed to the competitors will be strictly in accordance with the provisions of A.R.P Memorandum No. 20.

The local elimination contest for the Limerick Auxiliary Fire Service will take place on Sunday, 12th September, at 2.30 p.m., at the Docks. Thirteen crews are expected to take part, and all crews are in grim training. The winning crew will be awarded the local shield and presentation prizes, and will also travel to Dublin to represent the city. In former years the competition for the local shield has created much interest, and has moved the crews to white hot enthusiasm. With the much more important issues at stake this time the public may look forward to thrilling competition.

The whole A.R.P. machine of the city is to be shortly tested by a combined and general exercise, which will be witnessed by representatives of the Department of Defence.
