The total entries at Limerick Show amounted to 1,633, compared with 1,600 at the 1942 Show. The entries were made up as follows:—Horse Section, 114; Cattle, 58; Home Crafts, 275; Horticulture, 802; Dogs, 264; Jumping and Driving, 120.

DEATH OF MR. WILLIAM FINLAY

With very deep and sincere regret we chronicle the demise of Mr. William Finlay, general manager, Condensed Milk Co. (Ireland) Ltd., Limerick, which took place last night in a Cork hospital. Just a fortnight ago the deceased sustained a serious injury to the spine as the result of a fall from the roof of the boiler house of the factory, and despite the best medical care and attention his life could not be saved.

The late Mr. Finlay was one of the leading authorities in the country on the dairying industry. He had a distinguished career as a student at University College, Cork, where he obtained the degrees of B.Sc. and, later, M.Sc. (Dairying), both with first-class honours. He later lectured in the Dairy Technology department of the College for a number of years prior to taking up the appointment of assistant manager, and later general manager, of the Condensed Milk Company.

To his work he always brought that enthusiasm that characterised his student days, and indeed at the time the fatal accident occurred he was engaged in perfecting a system to enable pitch to be used for power.

The late Mr. Finlay was deservedly popular with all associated with the dairying industry, in regard to which he had accomplished much valuable research work. He had made many friends, too, in sporting circles. He was captain of Castle-troy Golf Club, Limerick, and in his early days he had been an active member of the U.C.C. hurling and Gaelic football clubs.

As a young man, Mr. Finlay, who was from County Tipperary, took a prominent part in the war of independence and was on active service from 1920 to 1923 with the South Tipperary Brigade.

To his widow and four young children sincere sympathy will be extended.

The remains will be removed from the Limerick railway station tomorrow (Saturday) at 10 a.m., to St. Munchin's Church, where Mass will be celebrated at 11 o'clock. The interment takes place on Sunday in Mount St. Lawrence cemetery, at 2 p.m.
