THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK. ANNUAL SHEEP SALE.

The entry for this important fixture, which was held on last Tuesday, August 31st, at the Paddocks, Limerick, exceeded last year by about 200 head, the total number being 1322. Lambs formed the larger section, numbering 739, and included several pens of outstanding merit, and generally speaking the bulk of the entries were of a most useful description, well bred and nicely brought out, a larger proportion being up to first class quality. Cross bred Oxford Downs and Suffolks came in for most attention and demand. There was strong enquiry and active trade for all classes of lambs. Prices showed a substantial advance on those of last year's annual sale. Top price went to Mr. E. Coleman, Lachnagour, Dromacomar, Kilmallock, at 134/- for a pen of extra choice cross bred lambs, the runner-up being Mr. Michael Frawley, Cratloe, at 122/- lambs, best, 110/- to 134/-; second run, 81/- to 106/-; small, 68/- to 80/-.

A nice entry of breeding ewes and store sheep, well up to the usual standard. In this section there was also brisk demand and advanced rates. Top prices paid for a pen the property of Mr. John Boyenizor, Kilbreedy, 158/-, and Mr. R. O'Dea, junr., Drombanna, 149/-.

Breeding ewes, best, 128/- to 158/-; second run, 98/- to 116/-; hogget ewes, best, 126/- to 149/-; second run, 104/- to 118/-; store sheep, 103/- to 132/-.

Fat sheep included a number of well done and suitable sheep, for which demand was quick and firm; the right class of well fed hoggets maintained a strong and comparatively dear range of values.

Mr. Martin O'Brien, Fanningstown, Fedamore, obtained for a pen of choice cross-bred hoggets the high figure of 182/-, and Mr. Henry O'Brien, Kilcaskin, Fedamore, 177/- Hoggets, best, 160/- to 182/-; second run, 136/- to 156/-.

The ram department numbered 75, comprising Oxford Downs, Suffolks, Roscommon and Lincolns, besides the ordinary class; good demand for useful lamb rams. The right stamp in this section drew brisk competition and sold well. Oxford Down ram lambs, 7½ gns. to 11½ gns. Top, Mr. E. H. Shier, Shanid View, Shanagolden, at 11½ gns. and 11 gns. twice. Suffolk ram lambs, 6½ gns. to 11 gns. Top, Mr. J. J. Smith, Newboro, Patrickswell, at 11 gns. and 10½ gns. to 10½ gns. Ordinary ram lambs, 6½ gns. to 9½ gns.; second run, 4 gns. to 6 gns. Top Mr. John Boyenizor, Kilbreedy, 9½ gns.

The attendance was large and most representative, buyers being present from a long distance, and included many strangers. A healthy tone was evident throughout the day, all pens cleared except four. The sale was the most successful ever held at the Paddocks, being easily a record for an annual sheep sale in entries, turnover and clearance.—Wm. B. Fitt and Co., Auctioneers.
