ANNUAL SHEEP SALE.

On Tuesday last, Mr. Louis de Courcy, auctioneer, held his third annual sheep sale, when all round, the sale was a pronounced success; the entry reached nearly 1,000, which was remarkably good for a sale just established. Buyers attended from many parts, while practically all the lots offered were represented. Bidding was keen, a remarkable feature being the fact that only one pen of lambs out of a large entry of fat and store sheep, and one heifer, remained unsold. Fat sheep sold very well, and showed an advance of 10s. per head as compared with the corresponding market last year; much more fat sheep could have been sold.
