They sold at from 40/- to 100/- each.****THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK.****WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.**

Wednesday, October 6th—Cattle—The entry for to-day's market showed a substantial increase, and in point of numbers was a record for the Paddocks, 485 head; all available accommodation filled to capacity. Quality and description well above the average. The stores included many choice drafts of two and a half year old bullocks, with a good proportion of beef and forward lots. Big attendance both shipping and home interests. The market generally indicated a steady tone, with an active trade for the lots of beef, which were easily placed at full terms; especially nice medium weighted heifers. Young fresh cows easily marketable at current rates; secondary and older sorts also changed hands. In the store cattle section a heavy entry, trade was active and strong with a healthy tone for promising feeders, previous rates well maintained. Forward feeding two and a half year old bullocks of the right stamp readily cashed, and moved out freely. Suitable young stores, both heifers and bullocks, enquired for and sold well, and top rates easily touched for the choice drafts. One and a half year old bullocks and heifers, with condition met brisk selling trade throughout the day, and commercial cattle easily cashed at firm rates; bullocks preferential trade. Backward and plainer types not so much in favour. The general tone of the market was marked with a business-like air and disposition, at full values. A considerably greater volume of business transacted than at any previous market, the turnover and clearance being easily a record. Fat heifers and bullocks, £26 15s. to £30; second run, £23 to £26; fat cows, best, £24 to £27; second run, £19 5s. to £23; old, £11 to £18; two and a half year old bullocks and heifers, best, £22 to £27; second run, £17 15s. to £21 10s.; one and a half year old bullocks and heifers, £17 5s. to £21; second run, £12 to £16 10s.

Sheep—A very full entry, about the same numbers as last week; a fairly useful selection to draw from, more stores. Usual attendance. Offers firm and ready for best pens, and sales easily effected. Hoggets of nice quality, well fed, met ready exchange at satisfactory terms; prime sheep looked for, and ample demand to take all shown. Sheep short of condition, demand not so active, and value position slightly easier than last week, although top rates were maintained for best sheep. Fresh young ewes a fair trade, old ewes dull. Store hoggets met enquiry and sale at slightly easier rates. Enquiry for fat lambs; store lambs in demand at current rates. Business throughout the day worked out steadily, with a substantial turnover and very satisfactory clearance. Fat middle weight, 120/- to 130/-; small, 102/- to 108/-; hoggets, fat, 133/- to 145/-; second run, 115/- to 125/-; small, 100/- to 108/-; ewes, 118/- to 127/6; lambs, best, 80/- to 93/-; second run, 67/- to 79/-—Wm. B. Fitt and Co., Auctioneers.

**THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK.****WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.**

Tuesday, October 5th—a full seasonable entry, with more cows than heifers; the bulk of the cows and heifers consisted of an average useful stamp, but did not include many high grade dairy cows. Buyers in strong attendance, several on the look out for choice dairy cows, which are scarce. Enquiry continues strong for the right stamp, and purchasers were quite willing to pay full values. Trade worked along the lines of last Tuesday, with a ready and quick demand for promising milchers; business was firm and steady, rates maintained on the higher level of prices, except for secondary and old cows. Medium-sized, coloury heifers showing quality were readily bid for. All round trade hardly as firm as last market, as the class on sale was not quite as good. Market sold up, except for a few old and inferior cows. Top price for dairy cows went to Mr. R. O'Dea, Drombanna, at £42, the purchaser being Mr. A. Rice, Whitehall, Parteen. Dairy cows, best, £34 to £42; ordinary, £23 10s. to £32 10s.; incalf and calved heifers, £27 to £31 10s.—Wm. B. Fitt and Co., Auctioneers.
