

## WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, October 26th—Heavier than last week, which included a good many promising cows and choice heifers; cows showing signs of milk were readily for and cashed at recent rates, the good cows could have been bid. The top price of £40 was obtained by Mr. Ml. Fitzgerald, nameade, Kilcornan, and Mr. Denis McGrath, Clounanna, Patrickswell. Second class cows were freely bid for, and changed hands. Twenty-six incalf and calved cows were on offer, the greater portion of which were good promising heifers; one extra choice cow, the property of Mr. Thomas Kelly, Askeaton, was sold for £43, the purchaser being Mr. James Barry, Bruff. Promising heifers were readily bid for, and a great many changed hands from £34 to £40. The entry was easily the heaviest of the autumn season, and a very substantial volume of business transacted, the clearance being particularly good, and the turnover a record. Dairy cows, £37 to £42 to £44 10s.; second run, £35 to £38; others, £28 to £32; incalf and calved heifers, best, £33 to £38 10s.; second run, £23 to £30 10s. Cattle—One of the heaviest entries of the autumn season, with a strong attendance, bidding freer, sales more easily obtained than at previous markets, a very heavy volume of business being transacted on the day, the turnover reaching record figures. Weanling calves, of which there was a good supply, sold particularly well, top price in this department being obtained by Mr. Edward Doherty, Carnane, Fedar, at £13 1s.
