CATTLE MARKETS, MULGRAVE STREET, LIMERICK.

Weekly Market, Saturday, Nov. 6.

Dairy cows and in-calf heifers, entry numerically the same as last week; buyers again in strong attendance for the good cows, all of which were sold under the hammer; secondary cows and heifers better trade than last week; only three lots remaining unsold. Top price for dairy cows was obtained by Mr. P. McNamara, Coolderra, Kildimo, at £42 10s. for a calved cow, the runner-up being Mr. H. O'Grady, Caherline, Pallasgreen, at £42. Top price for heifers was obtained by Mr. James Melody, Clonmoney, Bunratty, at £34 15s. for a calved heifer. In-calf and calved dairy cows, best, £38 5s. to £42 10s.; second run, £30 5s. to £37 5s.; others, £19 to £27 15s. In-calf and calved heifers, £20 10s. to £34 15s.

Stores—A very heavy entry; trade in this department was again quiet, buyers operating cautiously, and it was only where vendors were willing to sell at the lower rates that sales were effected. In spite of the slow trade a heavy volume of business was transacted and a good clearance was effected. The entry of weanling calves was the heaviest of the season, 79 coming under the hammer; trade for the good lots was very bright; some very good prices being realised; a big number of the calves being sold at from £12 to £13 10s. Top price in this department was obtained by Mr. P. Wixted at £13 10s., closely followed by Mr. John Ryan, Toureen, Ballysimon, whose five very choice calves were sold for £13 5s. per head; Mr. Fahy obtaining a similar price.
