**WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.**

Wednesday, November 17th—Cattle—Entry about the same as last week; a better class; a big ring and more buyers. Beef in strong demand, especially medium weight heifers, which met brisk competition and sale. Fresh young cows also found favour and easily cashed, full current rates. Secondary and older sorts met firm enquiry and steady sale. Large entry of stores and forward feeders; the best grades cashed where owners were willing to accept current prices; market in this section somewhat brighter than last week. In the young store cattle section an exceptionally good entry and class; an improved disposition in trade was manifested; prices slightly firmer; all lots showing quality and condition readily cashed; also promising feeders. Calves met a particularly good market; dearer rates, especially for choice heifers; practically all cleared. Business throughout the day steady on the lower basis of prices, with a slightly firmer tone, and on the whole the general run of trade showed more life than last market, with a substantially increased turnover and good clearance. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £27 to £33 15s.; second run, £21 to £26 10s.; fat cows, £22 5s. to £27 10s.; second run, £18 5s. to £20 10s.; old, £11 5s. to £17; 2½ year-old bullocks and heifers £19 5s. to £24 5s.; 1½ year-old bullocks and heifers, best, £16 5s. to £22 15s.; second run, £11 10s. to £16; calves, £11 2s. 6d. to £12; second run, £7 10s. to £8 17s. 6d.

Sheep—Increased numbers; a very full entry; the class a better description; well fed sheep in demand and easily cashed, with brisk competition; prices around recent currencies. Good sheep are wanted. Best hoggets enquired for, and sold freely; full rates. Secondary and thinny meated sorts tedious. There was strong enquiry and more good sheep could have been sold. Small entry of lambs; quiet trade. Young ewes in condition fair demand and sale. Enquiry for fresh, well bred feeding hoggets, which met fair selling trade and about held their values. Rough and poor sorts slow demand; buyers for useful lambs. Sales all round well up to the level of last market. Full attendance of buyers, and a good sell up. Hoggets, best, 140/- to 153/-; second run, 125/- to 137/6; stores, best, 115/- to 125/-; second run, 82/- to 112/6; ewes, 95/- to 107/-; lambs, 82/6 to 95/-; second run, 60/- to 75/-—Wm. B. **ANNUAL BULL CALF SALE.**

This annual fixture was held on Friday last, November 12th, by Messrs. Wm. B. Fitt & Co., the entry numbering 170; almost equal to last year's record. The entry included 88 licensed bull calves; easily the highest entry in this section. The class on the whole was good, and well up to last year, and included quite a number of really choice young bulls, with shape and colour, several of outstanding merit, the property of well known exhibitors at this sale. Big attendance of buyers; many from a distance. There was active enquiry and demand for anything with promise, colour and quality, particularly for the licensed bull calves. The choicer animals attracted brisk competition; nicely bred calves of the right stamp were freely bid for; and found ready buyers at full values. Small calves and those lacking quality and condition met a slow and quiet trade. Top price for licensed bull calves went to Mrs. E. Quinlan, Cullen, Co. Tipperary, at 33½ gns., the purchaser being Mr. Ml. O'Connor, Ballahadigne, Listowel. The runner-up being Mr. Ml. Quin, Glenbane, Emly, at 28 gns. to Mrs. E. Quinlan, Cullen, Co. Tipperary. Mr. John Hogan, Ballyneety Rock, Pallasgreen, obtained top price for unlicensed bull calves at 23½ gns. purchased by Mr. P. Gleeson, Buffanoka, Cappamore, and Mr. J. Hickey, Oola Hills, Oola, obtained 21 gns., the purchaser being Mr. John Liston, Ballycasey, Kildimo. All round there was a
