MR. C. SPARLING, ROUR.

The death occurred on the 10th inst. at his residence, Rour, Adare, of Mr. Christopher Sparling, after a protracted illness. The deceased belonged to a very old family, who were always held in the highest esteem by all sections of the community. He kept a most hospitable house for the boys on the run during the Black and Tan regime in Ireland, and both his family and himself suffered many privations and hardships during that time. His largely-attended funeral, floral tributes, telegrams and messages of sympathy were a striking tribute to the memory of the deceased, and the feelings of regret entertained at his demise by the members of his family and friends. The funeral service was conducted by the Rev. O. S. Daunt, and the interment took place in the family burial place, Adare Cemetery.
