The death occurred on the 19th inst. at his residence, Rour, Adare, of Mr. Christopher Sparling, after a protracted illness. He kept a most hospitable house for the boys on the run during the Black and Tan regime in Ireland, and both his family and himself suffered many privations and hardships during that time. 


