WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET, AND ANNUAL XMAS FAT STOCK SALE.

Wednesday, December 15th—The entry in both cattle and sheep numbered 1,083 head. There was a big and most representative attendance, including many from a distance and some strangers. In the cattle section an extra good show of beef; suitable heifers and bullocks in brisk demand and readily placed at top current rates; handy sized heifers best demand. A heavy entry of young fresh, well-bred beef cows, which were freely bid for and cashed; rates favouring vendors. Forward bullocks also met a free sale; all lots of suitable fat cattle readily placed at top rates. Nice forward stores came in for attention. In young stores a small supply; useful description which met good demand at recent rates. Heifer calves showing colour and quality met a free sale. Plainer descriptions a bit tedious. Trade was buoyant for all classes to close of day. Market almost cleared. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £27 to £32 5s.; second run, £21 10s. to £26. Fat cows, best, £24 10s. to £29 10s.; second run, £17 to £22 10s.; old, £9 15s. to £16; 2½ year-old bullocks and heifers, £19 15s. to £21 10s. 1½ year-old bullocks and heifers, £15 to £18 10s.; second run, £10 7s. to £14 5s. Calves, best, £10 5s. to £14 1s.; second run, £7 5s. to £9 7s. 6d.

Sheep—One of the heaviest entries of the year. All available accommodation being filled. A splendid turn-out of tip-top sheep. Strong attendance. Brisk bidding and competition for choice pens; buyers being quite willing to part full values; a firm tone ruled, with a ready repetition of last week's top rates, and in some cases extra choice pens a turn in favour of vendors. Well fed hoggets and wethers with quality had plenty of buyers, and nice small sheep also found favour. Young fresh ewes met a fair trade. Small entry of fat lambs; useful thick sorts with quality bid for and sold. Store lambs easier, and difficult to place. The general disposition showed stability and a steady selling trade experienced throughout the day. All round one of the best markets of the year; an exceptionally heavy volume of business transacted. Hoggets, best, 137/6 to 153/-; second run, 117/6 to 135/-; stores, 97/6 to 116/-; ewes, best, 106/- to 133/-; second run, 67/6 to 90/-; lambs, 80/- to 95/-; second run, 61/- to 75/-. The turnover showed a substantial increase on last year's record Christmas market.—Wm. B. Fitt & Co., Auctioneers.
