Dairy cows and in-calf heifers; entry at 58 head was the heaviest of this season, and comprised a useful selection of cows and heifers; no really outstanding cows were on offer, but some very promising useful in-calf and calved cows came under the hammer; these again drew keen competition; the bidding for the spring calving in-calf heifers was surprisingly good and fast, all of them being sold under the hammer. The dairy cows and springing heifers on offer were practically all sold, resulting in only a few lots in this department being unsold. Top price for dairy cows was obtained by Mr. Michael Murnane, Violet Hill, Broadford, at £39, and for in-calf heifers, Mr. John Callinan, Ballinamona, Knocklong, obtained top price at £34 10s. Dairy cows, best, £36 10s. to £39; second run, £31 to £35; others, £17 to £26. Calved and springing heifers, best, £30 to £34 10s.; second run, £23 to £27. Spring calving in-calf heifers, best, £25 10s. to £27 10s.; second run, £23 to £24 10s.; others, £18 to £22 15s. The turnover in this department being a record for this season.

Stores—A considerable increase in entry, which included some useful lots of choice store cattle; these again experienced a slow, dull trade, but where vendors were willing to take the lower values sales were easily effected. The entry in the weanling department was good, and included some very choice lots which again drew top rates. Top price in this department was obtained by Mrs. Collins, Newtown, Ballysimon, at £13 5s. Two year-old bullocks and heifers, £16 10s. to £19. One and a half year-old bullocks and heifers, best, £14 15s. to £16; second run, £12 17s. 6d. to £13 10s.; small, £11 to £12. Calves—Mr. Michael Kirby, Crecora, obtained £16 for a bull calf. Weanlings, best, £11 10s. to £13 5s.; second run, £8 5s. to £10; small, £3 17s. 6d. to £5 2s.—Louis de Courcy, Auctioneer.
