Steady trade for useful and promising cows; the right class found favour, and were quickly sold at full current rates; backward and secondary cows did not attract attention; the right stamp is wanted and more could have been sold. The heaviest entry of in-calf heifers for some time, and included a number of promising heifers which met brisk trade; medium sized heifers also found favour, and for this class exchange was readily effected. A steady selling trade, and no difficulty in exchange for the promising class. Poor and thin heifers not in favour. Business over the day worked out satisfactorily, the turnover being easily a record for Christmas week. The market finished strong with an exceptionally good clearance.
