

WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, January 4th—Full seasonable entry; about equal number of heifers and cows. In the cow section no really choice lots on offer, the class on sale being mostly secondary and old cows. Trade brisk for promising cows, and those on offer made full current rates. Poor and thin cows also found favour, and sold at late rates. The in-calf heifers were a choice and promising selection, and were in keen demand, and showed an advance on recent markets, rates favouring vendors; trade in this department was brisk and active, and in the case of choice heifers competition was particularly keen; more of this class could have been sold. Full attendance of shipping and local interests. A satisfactory market, with a practical clearance effected. Top price for heifers went to Mr. M. Hanly, Spring Lodge, Manister, at £38, the runner-up being Mr. Ed. Baker, Rosbrien, at £35.
