WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, February 29th—Numerically a much better register than last week, including a number of choice heifers and cows. For every class there was an evident and strong demand. The market was favoured with nice weather, which gave a touch of lustre and richness to the coats of the heifers. Numerous buyers, some attending from a long distance; business ruled easy at the start, because the earlier lots were not exactly the best in general favour, but this did not last long and when the choice heifers came under the hammer they were keenly competed for. It was clear from the competition that the price level of currencies would be well maintained, which proved to be a fact, as there was no lack of buyers willing to secure the best type. Speaking generally there were buyers for every class, and where some lots failed to change hands it was because vendors were out for extreme rates. Choice and promising dairy cows also came in for much attention and brisk competition; a busy sphere and steady trade to the end of the day. A substantially greater volume of business transacted than last Tuesday, with a strong wind up and practical clearance. Top price for heifers was obtained by Mr. John O'Brien, High Park, Caherconlish, and Mrs. M. O'Connell, Friarstown House, Limerick, at £37. The best price for dairy cows obtained by Mr. Jas. O'Brien, Ballinahouna, Croom, at £40 10s., the buyer being Mr. P. Barry, Bridgetown, Co. Limerick, at £40.
 Choice calf heifers, choice, £32 to £37; promising, £28 to £30 10s.; ordinary, £18 to £26; dairy cows, best, £29 15s. to £40 10s.; ordinary, £20 to £29.
