

## OBITUARY

### MR. P. F. ENGLISH

Deep and widespread regret was occasioned by the passing of Mr. Patrick F. English, "Rosehill," O'Callaghan Strand, Limerick, whose death occurred at his residence on the 29th ult. His last illness was borne with resignation, and his death in the prime of life removed from our midst a man who had won the respect of all who had come in contact with him.

Deceased had been an official of the Department of Agriculture for over 20 years. He had served as Cow-Testing Instructor, Inspector under the Slaughter of Cattle and Sheep Acts, Allotments Inspector, and latterly as Inspector of Mills. He was widely known and was always a most courteous and efficient officer. He was also a keen gardener and sportsman. He leaves a widow and six children, to whom his death is a sad blow.

The funeral, which took place from St. Munchin's Church after High Mass, was attended by all sections of the community, and was a testimony to the esteem in which he was held. The Department of Agriculture was represented by a number of his colleagues, and a guard of honour was provided by the L.S.F., of which he had been a member.

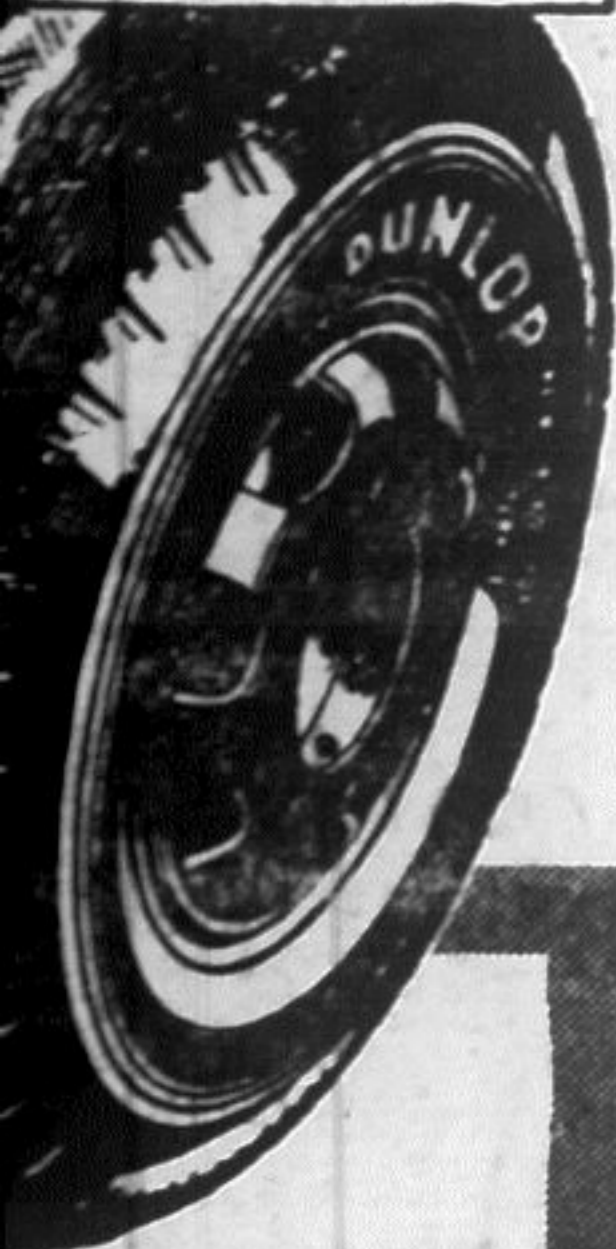
