

## DAILY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, June 21st—Cattle—Increased class on sale well up to last week. Good chance. In beef, nice quality medium heifers and bullocks were readily cashed wanted; heavy sorts not so much in favour to the hot weather. Fresh young cows placed; full current values ruled; practically all beef lots cleared. Aged store cattle lower trade. In young store cattle section entry, including some useful drafts of feeders, for which there was steady demand. Dairy heifers were in fair demand at rates, especially nice roans and greys; dairy cattle dull, and hard to turn into Yearlings, a smaller show; nicely bred dogs with colour met fair enquiry and late rates. Over the day's proceedings was steady selling trade, with values on basis of last week's level. Full seasonable and satisfactory clearance. Fat heifers bullocks, best, £30 to £33 15s.; second run, £29 10s.; fat cows, £24 to £28 10s.; first run, £13 to £20 5s.; old, £13 15s. to year-old bullocks and heifers, £18 10s. to £10s.; second run, £13 10s. to £18; dogs, £10 15s. to £15 10s.; second run, £10 5s. Sheep—Extra heavy supply; a useful selection to draw from. Usual chance of buyers. Pens of nice quality in fair demand at slightly easier rates; hoggets also enquired for. All round was quieter, with a weaker tendency; trading on a lower basis; sheep short of on met a slow trade; good sheep are Ewes dull. Store sheep quiet, and to turn into money. Well done fat lambs bid for at current rates. All round was not as brisk as last Wednesday; operating cautiously. Market moved in er groove; however, a good clearance was l.
