WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, June 28th—Cattle—Much smaller entry, ordinary description, in beef handy weights, both heifers and bullocks freely bid for and cashed; nice well-fed young cows easily placed, firm trade and demand, scarcity of store cattle, both aged and young; trade quiet in this department. Well bred feeders of the light stamp changed hands at recent values. Fat heifers and bullocks, £27 to £29 10s.; second run, £23 to £25 10s.; fat cows, £27 to £28 5s.; second run, £17 15s. to £18 10s.; two year old heifers and bullocks, small, £12 15s. to £16; yearlings, £11 2s. 6d. to £13 5s.
Sheep—Lighter entry, fair proportion of good sheep, choice pens in active demand, and drew more money than last market; trade active and firm for well fed sheep, which were easily washed with competition. Best hoggets enquired for and sold freely; fresh young ewes steady trade. All round prices better than last Wednesday; good sheep are wanted. Store sheep, owing to shortage of grass difficult to exchange. Well done fat lambs a free sale, top rates. Trade all round well supported, with an early finish, and practical clearance. 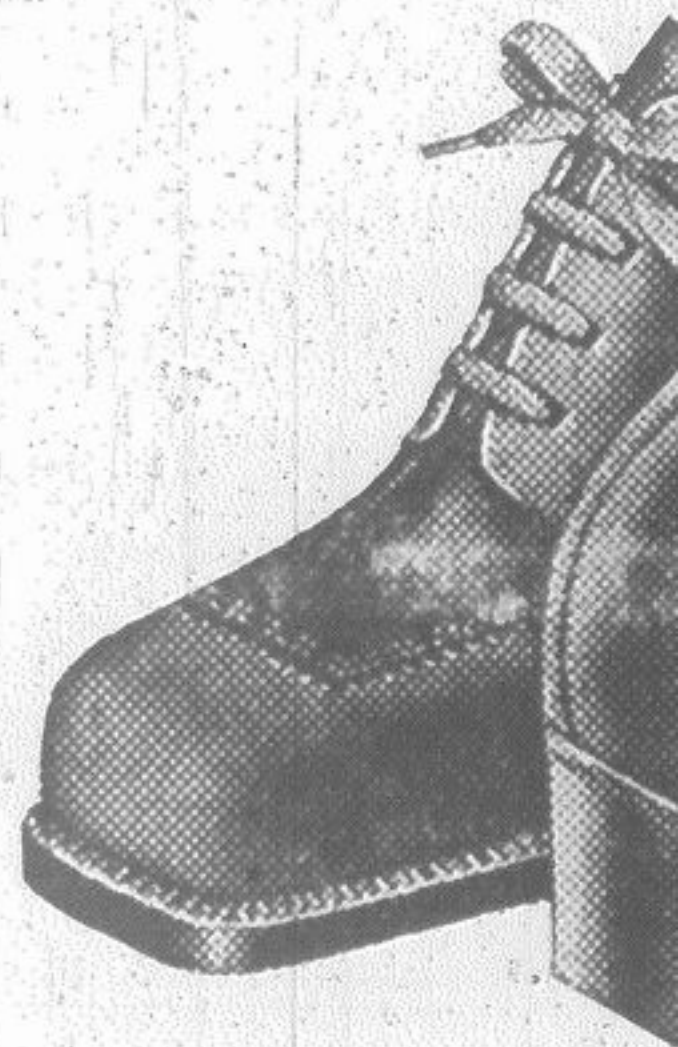
