beare her baceous plants and chrysanthemums. Dig up and transplant daffodil bulbs that require shifting. Prick out flowers, forget-me-nots, double daisies. Brompton stocks, etc., into a nursery bed. Leave them 4 inches apart in lines 10 inches asunder. Dry off Arum lilies to prepare them. for re-potting next month.

Pot off cinerarias and primula obconicus into 5, 6 and 7 inch pots and grow on in a cold frame facing the north.

Roses must be kept free of aphis by frequent sprayings or dustings with Derris powder. Rose and fruit stocks may be budded now.

The faded flowers of bush roses should be constantly picked off to keep the beds tidy and encourage more flowers. The same may be

said for sweet pea.

As soon as the flowers have faded on early rambler roses the old flowering shoots should be pruned off and the young shoots tied in to take their place.


MR. MICHAEL HAYES. KILFINANE.
