### FIXTURE POSTPONED

Union has been informed by the Department of Industry and Commerce that the Minister made an order, following a report from the Wages Tribunal, granting a supplementary bonus of 1/- per day to casual dockers employed at the port of Limerick. This brings the total bonus to 2/6 per day. The Minister has also made an order granting a supplementary bonus of 1/- per week to employees of Cement Ltd., Mungret, bringing the total bonus to the maximum of 11/- per week.
