Wednesday, July 12th—Cattle—The entry
of much larger dimensions than last week,

nice medium weight heifers and bullocks
readily cashed and wanted; steady trade
good competition for prime cattle. Cow
met a quieter trade, unless for nicely done
medium sized heiferish cows; practically all
lots cleared. The store cattle section com-
prised principally two year-olds and yearlings,
included some useful drafts of well-bred
heifers, for which there was a steady demand,
especially heifers; enquiry being the best for
weeks; choice cattle a turn dearer.
Yearling bred yearlings with colour fairly good
dry, and a ready sale; better rates. Over
the day there was all round steady selling
for promising and useful cattle, and a
satisfactory clearance effected. Fat
and bullocks, best, £27 to £30 10s.;
second run, £22 to £26 15s.; fat cows, £26 to
£28 15s.; second run, £20 to £22 5s.; old, £14
to £18 15s. Two year-old bullocks and heifers,
£17 10s. to £23 2s. 6d.; second run, £12
to £16 10s.; yearlings, £11 5s. to £13 15s.;
and run, £8 to £10 5s. Sheep—Shorter
class; mixed class. Full attendance of
buyers; trade opened rather quiet; buyers a
bit cautious. However, there was fairly good
enquiry for best pens, and rates repeated
the week's top prices; secondary and rough
lots tedious. Nice medium weight hoggets
met steady demand. Ewes a quiet trade.
Hoggets and lambs cashed around previous
rates. Choice fat lambs fit for the trade met
a ready sale at top rates. Satisfactory clear-
ance. Fat middle weight, 107/6 to 120/-; fat
lambs, 115/- to 132/-; second run, 100/- to
115/-; small, 75/- to 97/6; lambs, best, 70/-
