OBITUARY

MR. MICHAEL J. PHELAN, NEWCASTLE WEST.

Very deep and widespread regret was occasioned by the death last week in St. John's Hospital, Limerick, after a brief illness, of Mr. Michael J. Phelan, National Health Insurance Inspector, South Quay, Newcastle West. The deceased, who was aged about 50 years, leaves five orphans to mourn his loss, as he was predeceased by his wife less than twelve months ago. He was son of the late William Phelan, T.C., Newcastle West, one of the best known and most highly-respected nationalists in Munster in his day, and brother of Mr. James Phelan, the well-known Newcastle West hardware merchant, and of Mr. William Phelan, merchant, Galbally. Of a very kindly, genial and good-hearted disposition, he enjoyed, as he fully deserved, the respect, confidence and esteem of all who knew him. In his capacity as Health Insurance Inspector he was a very capable official and was held in high regard by his superior authorities and by the public with whom he had official dealings. His death removes a very popular and estimable figure and we extend our sincere sympathy to his family and brothers and the numerous other bereaved relatives.

A huge concourse attended the funeral from Newcastle West Parish Church to Churchtown on Sunday. Right Rev. Monsignor Hannan, P.P., V.G., officiated and eight clergy from the district attended the obsequies.
