WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, August 2nd—Numbers on sale showed a substantial increase on last week, and better class; beef in fair numbers; active demand; rates well up to current values. Small entry of beef cows; nicely done fat cattle sold readily and wanted; well bred stores with condition, especially bullocks, found ready purchasers at slightly better rates. Large entry of young store cattle, which met a very quiet trade; well bred one-and-a-half year-old bullocks and heifers with condition changed hands at late rates, but for other classes concession was necessary to facilitate exchange. Owing to harvesting operations being in full swing there was not a large attendance of buyers. Fat heifers and bullocks, £24 to £28 s.; second run, £20 to £23 10s. two-and-a-half year-old bullocks and heifers, £19 2s. 6d. to £25; one-and-a-half year-old heifers and bullocks, £13 5s. to £16 10s.; second run, 7 12s. 6d. to £11 5s.

Sheep—Smaller supplies; useful class in general, including some pens of prime quality; average attendance. Suitable selections freely bid for; nicely done sheep of medium weights secured preference and found ready buyers; well fed sheep with quality wanted and easily washed; sheep short of condition and secondary class a quieter trade; fresh ewes with quality a fair selling trade; fat lambs a small supply; easier rates; store sheep and lambs met a very quiet trade.
