PRICE OF GAS

(To the Editor, "Limerick Leader")

Dear Sir—Please grant me space to ventilate a grievance affecting the majority of your readers. Last week householders were visited by an employee of the Corporation Gas Department with the object of further reducing the amount of gas supplied to consumers at a greatly increased price.
