WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Monday September 6th.—Cattle—Increased in last week; in beef section more bullocks and heifers; steady demand; full current market. Nicely done heiferish cows bid for and beef wanted and easily sold. Good quality. Stores mainly young cattle; mixed biddings were on the lower basis of vendors unwilling to accept; a quiet session ruled, marked in this section demand. Fat heifers, £27 5s. to £28 15s.; bullocks, £19 to £23 15s.; 2½ year-old bullocks, £24 to £27; second year-old cows, £22 to £27; old, £11 5s. to £16 15s.—Seasonable entry; an average useful including some pens of nice quality. Due to the inclemency of the weather small number of buyers; demand consequently was not so well fed hoggets with quality were in favour; buyers showing a cooler disposition; previous rates not repeated. Fat and lambs met a dull market. Ewes hard to sell less young and fresh, and then on a small scale. Fair clearance. Fat middle lambs, 101/- to 114/-; hoggets, 108/- to 114/-; small, 100/- to 105/-; ewes, 50/- to 60/-; lambs, 57/6 to 65/-.—Wm. B. Fitt & Co. Auctioneers.
