MR. T. McNAMARA, CLONDRINAGH, LIMERICK.

The death, as already announced, of Mr. "Tom" McNamara removes from the North Liberties and surrounding districts one of the best known and most lovable members of an old-established family. Brother of the late Rev. Michael McNamara, P.P., Paramatta; the late Dr. Matt McNamara, and the late Jack McNamara, Shelbourne, he was an extensive and successful farmer. In his younger days he was a sprinter of note, an able exponent of Gaelic football in its early stages, and proud holder of one of the first All-Ireland medals won by Limerick Commercial in 1887. At a later stage he joined the famous old Garryowen Rugby Club, giving sterling service for some years. Sports of all kinds had for him a wonderful attraction, and he maintained interest right to the end.

The funeral from St. Munchin's Church on Saturday last to Mount St. Lawrence was striking testimony to the esteem in which "Tom" McNamara was held by all classes. To give a list of those who paid a last tribute to a great sportsman would be impossible.
