Co. Limerick Tragedy

A sensational shooting affair took place at Hospital, Co. Limerick, to day, as the result of which a wellknown public official, Mr. Joseph Kirwan, M.Sc., Inspector of Vocational Schools for Munster, lost his life.

Erom the meagre details to hand, it would appear that the deceased was in the Vocational School at Hospital in connection with his inspectorial duties. Suddenly a shot rang out and Mr. Kirwan collapsed. having received the full force of the bullet. He expired in a short time, of the warships, heavily
