THE INTERMENT

The interment of Mother M. Ita Wallace took place at the Presentation Convent, Limerick, on the 2nd November. Beloved in life and deeply regretted in death by the community, to whose interests she unselfishly devoted her energy and time for the long span of twenty-three years while she filled the office of Bursar, her passing away has caused much sorrow among her Sisters in religion. Her amiability and kindness, and her unflinching charity towards the sick and suffering as well as her solicitude for their welfare, were the characteristics that edified those among whom she lived.

To the appeals of the poor, Mother Ita always listened and ever proved herself a generous friend in all their afflictions. After a long life of labour (55 years) spent in the service of Christ, may we not hope that her happy death on the vigil of All Saints was a foretaste of the hundredfold promised to those who leave all for God.

TOWN PLANNING.

A Special Committee of the City Council has had under consideration for some time past the Town Planning Report prepared by Mr. Manning Robertson, F.R.I.B.A., M.R.I.A.I., Town Planning Consultant, under the Town and Regional Planning Acts, 1934 to 1939. The Committee, before coming to a final decision, are anxious that such an important Report, on which will be based the planning scheme "for the general purpose of securing the orderly and progressive development" of the City of Limerick, for many generations to come, should be studied by the commercial and labour organisations in the City, as well as by other interested organised bodies of citizens. For that purpose, printed copies of the Report may be had, on written application to the undersigned, by Secretaries of Organisations.

When the Report has been studied, the Special Committee of the Council invite Organisations to submit suggestions in writing on the recommendations and proposals contained therein, but it is requested that such suggestions should reach the undersigned not later than the 31st December, 1944.

MALE ATTENDANT REQUIRED, CITY DISPENSARY.

The Corporation of Limerick require the services of one full-time Male Attendant at the Babies Clinic, City Dispensary.
