Louis de Courcy, auctioneer, held his bull calf sale at the Cattle Market, on Friday last, 17th November. It has now been firmly established, and the number of entries has shown a steady increase since the opening sale a few years ago; the entry was slightly higher as compared with last year, but quality was not so good;—representative attendance. The licensed bulls was quiet; the market applied to the licensed bull calves showing promise, these sold easily at prices offered vendors. Top price for bulls went to Mr. P. O'Malley, Macotty, Co. Limerick, at 17 guineas, the purchaser being Mr. D. O'Neill, Caherline, price for licensed bull calves went to Messrs McCormack, Cappavilla, Clonlara, at 11½ guineas, the purchaser being Patrick Ryan, Coosam, Birdhill, Macotty, and for unlicensed bull calves, to Mr. Fitzgerald, Friarstown, Grange, at 14½ guineas for a very good calf, the purchaser being Mr. Shanahan. Only a few lots remained unlicensed, and a half year-old licensed bulls, best, 15 to 17; seconds, 10½ to 12, 7½ to 8½; licensed bull calves, best, 11½; seconds, 7½ to 9½; unlicensed bull calves, best, 10½ to 14½; seconds, 7½ to 10.
