### DEATH OF RETIRED TEACHER

A well-known West Limerick teacher, and one whose passing will cause past pupils, at home and in exile, to recall happy memories of all she did for them, has passed away in the person of Mrs. Margaret Mary Danaher, ex-N.T., whose death occurred at her residence, Sunvale, Athea, on Thursday, the 14th inst. (writes our Athea correspondent). In failing health for some time back, her death, though not unexpected, is deeply mourned by a host of grateful pupils and parents, and sincere sympathy is extended to her bereaved husband and family.

A native of the Kilmallock district, Mrs. Danaher was for over 30 years principal of Athea Girls National School—retiring about five years ago. A lady of wide culture and deep spirituality, she infused her own high order of life and conduct into the moulding of the characters of her pupils. Her conception of education went beyond the prescribed course or text book, and the sorrow of the many who to-day mourn her passing will be mingled with gratitude for the interest and concern she took in them—especially in their final years under her care and in their early years in the outer world. Her knowledge of the difficulties that lay before them, her wisdom and kindness, made her an ideal counsellor, whose advice was often sought, freely given and never refused. Her high ideals gave her girls confidence in themselves and the constant exchange of letters and recurring visits from former pupils afforded her a singular delight and carried her back to former happy days. A large and representative cortege attended the funeral on Friday from Athea Parish Church to Rathkeale Cemetery.
